UPDATENANCIAL

Early 2020, ahead of EPC's annual meeting, you'll have a chance to see in full how our church's budget, expenses, and other financials did during 2019 as well as a chance to look at and vote on our 2020 budget.

Here is a preview featuring some good things to know about your church's financial position.



EPC has <u>no</u> mortgage and <u>no</u> debt. This means that any contributions you make support current and future programs rather than to pay for activities that took place years ago.

Pledges for 2020 exceeded the goal your Trustees and Session had set. **Pledges for the coming year are up more than 12% over the amount pledged in 2019.** At many churches that trend line is going down instead of up. EPC is headed in the right direction, and everyone is grateful for your continued generosity!

The Trustees made a detailed forecast for how 2019 would turn out, and they expect **EPC will be right on budget** ... despite a number of unexpected costs for maintaining our building and grounds. You can be sure that people at EPC are careful with every dollar and squeeze a penny 'til Lincoln hollers. Even more, volunteers saved money by investing their time and talents into a number of vital projects.

Our goals and our mission lead to a budget that is bigger than our pledges alone support. In 2019 we used some of the money that EPC had put aside in prior years, and our 2020 budget calls for drawing out some of those funds as well. However, **during 2019**, **EPC's investments performed very well** — and this helped to replace much of the money that we drew out of our funds for operating expenses. Through November, **EPC's total assets (money in the bank plus investments) were down only 1.5%, despite our having drawn about \$58,000 from our existing funds.**

During 2020 we will be working on other ways to raise funds. For example, our large, centrally located building is an important asset. We will continue to look for tenants who might want to rent ongoing space in our building. In addition, we will experiment with other options. For instance, in February we are hoping to host a conference of Christian educators that will offer an opportunity for one-time revenue.

Everything points to mission. While mission is a vital line item in our annual budget, virtually all we do comes back to our mission to house the homeless, feed the hungry, and to share the grace that our Lord gives so generously to us. So, for example, while our utility bills don't really seem much like they are related to mission, consider what a warm space in our building and access to clean washrooms means to our PADS guests ... or what our sanctuary means to people who gather at a memorial service. Plus, **the mission line item doesn't capture all that we do**, whether it is Christmas gifts for children at Erie House or helping a refugee family to furnish their first apartment in America.



WINTER + SPRING


