Dear EPC Members and Friends.

This year we will be celebrating Advent and Christmas at home more than ever before. This newsletter details some of our plans as a community, but this is also the year to spend some time creating a holy Advent at home. Here are some ideas for you.



Set an Advent Ontention

Spiritual practice is not just "accidental." Df your Advent season is to be a time where connection, family time, and spiritual practice are the focus, it will happen because you and your family have made it a priority. This is not easy, and it goes against the tide of culture. Before the hustle and bustle of the season, take a few moments to set an Advent intention. What would you like the season to look like? Would you like to intentionally limit the number of outside invitations you accept as a family in order to have peace and less rush? Would you like to set aside one day of the week for family time? Maybe you would like to be guided by an Advent word like peace, joy, hope or love. Get the whole family in on the discussion, as age and maturity level allow. Of you choose, write down your intention in a journal or somewhere the whole family can see it.

Create a Sacred Space

Advent and Christmas is a time for decorating and making space. As you prepare your home for Christmas, consider setting apart a sacred space that will be devoted to some of the prayers and practices in this book. The sacred space can be a small table, set apart for this book, some of the prayers inside, written on slips of paper, your Advent calendar, or any of the other symbols you create as you work through the practices of this book. Perhaps you will add some candles or sacred objects from your own family. However you create the space, your family will know that it is set apart for spiritual practice. Of you have the space, add a chair where family members can come and sit for a few minutes of peace and quiet during the season.

A Prayer for Advent

We pause and think about what we want this season to be:

- a season of hope,
- a season of peace,
- a season of joy,
- a season of love,
- a season of family togetherness,
- a season of reflection.
- God, please help us find meaning and purpose in this season, and may we fill our days with gratitude

Alfred S. Burt, an American jazz musician, is famous for composing Christmas carols. He wrote carols to carry on the family tradition, started by his father, Episcopal church rector, Bates G. Burt, of including original Christmas carols on the family Christmas card. Burt eventually married and moved to Hollywood in pursuit of his music career. The Christmas card list grew from 50 to

450 people. Still, his carols remained unknown outside the Burts' growing mailing list. Until 1952, when he finished writing the music to Come, Dear Children during a rehearsal with the Blue Reys vocal group. He asked them to sing it so he could make sure the harmonies worked; they liked it so much that they asked Burt if they could sing it at a Christmas party. Dt proved to be a hit among the party guests, and served to introduce Burt's carols to Hollywood.

Caroling, Caroling is one of Burt's most beloved carols. This year, caroling through the snow with friends seems highly unlikely. At a time of year when the EPC musicians are usually running from one performance to the next, they are staying closer to home! Thanks to technology at church and at home, there will be carols a-plenty during our online Worship services.

Keith Baumann has been working extremely hard on getting the new video and audio system up and running at EPC. There have been many technical challenges to tackle, but he has just completed his first successful test recording and is happy to announce that we will be using the new equipment to record readings and sermons for Advent and Christmas Eve. He would also like to acknowledge Rob Kopecky for all his support and help with this immense project.

Gayle Bisesi will continue to contribute via recording from her home studio. Look forward to seeing more members of the Bisesi family sharing their musical talents with us this month! Paul Heinz, pianist, is wisely using this time to mix a new album and, finish his basement.
