

Dear Friends,

It is with bittersweet feelings that I write this letter to officially inform you that I will be retiring from my position as Associate Pastor of Elmhurst Presbyterian Church, effective December 25, 2017. After much prayer and discernment, I have decided that this is a good time for me to move into a new chapter of my life. My husband Phil retired eight months ago, and now that I've gotten used to having him around again, I want to be able to join him in doing some traveling, and spending more time with our wonderful children and grandbabies. I am also very much aware that Elmhurst Presbyterian Church is not a two Pastor church right now. I am hoping that my leaving will open the door to finding a new Christian Education Director who can focus our energies on rebuilding our children and youth ministries. I am currently working on building ministry teams in the areas of Worship Design, Children and Youth Ministries, and Care Teams that will carry out the areas of ministry that I have been responsible for.

Since September 2006, it has been my deepest privilege to serve all of you; first as an intern while I was in seminary, and then as your newly ordained Associate Pastor. I will be forever grateful to all of you for putting your faith in me as we grew together in our roles as Pastor, congregation, and friends. You loved and nurtured me along as I learned what it meant to be a Pastor, and I thank you for all your encouragement and support through the years. Serving Elmhurst Presbyterian Church as your Pastor has been without a doubt one of the most fulfilling jobs I have ever had, and I look back at all the times we walked together as precious: times that have included so many joys and celebrations as well as those times of grief and sorrow when we all pulled together as a faith community. Like all faith communities, we have also walked through times of challenge and discernment; not knowing exactly where we were going or how we were going to get there. But with faith in the power of God's Spirit, and the leadership of so many of you who love and care deeply for this church, we have witnessed the opening of a multitude of windows through which God has ushered in the fresh breezes that have filled this church with new life and possibilities. And for that I am indeed grateful.

God has blessed this congregation with so many gifted, committed, faithful, loving people, and I will deeply miss serving alongside of all of you. But I believe that we will remain friends, as well as sisters and brothers in Christ forever; and I will continue to pray for you in your journey of discerning where God is now leading you as a faith community. I have no doubt that God has great plans for Elmhurst Presbyterian Church as you continue to be a place that works for justice, peace, equality, welcome for everyone, and grace. Touched by grace we will live differently, right?

Session Meeting Update from November 22, 2017

Session members expressed appreciation to the leadership and other volunteers who made Grace Cafe such a success.

The job description for the Director of Children and Youth Ministry was approved.

Congregation meetings were approved for December 3, 2017, and January 21, 2018, both after church. The purpose of the December 3 meeting is to elect officers for 2018, to dissolve the associate pastor relationship with Reverend Diane Slocum, to dissolve the associate pastor position, and to hear updates from the Pastor Nominating Committee and the Director of Children and Youth Ministry search team. The motion also included the approval of December 24, 2017 as Reverend Slocum's last day of work with her salary being paid through December 31, due to unused vacation time. The purpose of the January 21 congregation meeting is to present the annual report and budget.

For leaders of groups represented in the Annual Report, group reports are due to Karen Bircher **no later than January 2, 2018.**

The trustees request all pledges be sent as soon as possible. It's not too late!

Advent 2017 "Seeing The Sacred"

"The Word became flesh and made a home among us." (John 1:14)

The Advent/Christmas season is a time when the juxtaposition of the sacred and the secular sometimes feel blatantly opposed and, at other times, quite blurred. The word "sacred" points to something dedicated as "holy" and "set apart." We all know that the busy-ness of the holiday season can overrun the sense of the sacred. So this year, we will begin our Advent journey toward Christmas by emphasizing the gift of the "now"... the gift of sacred time given to God, to family and friends and to those in need of help.

We invite you to join us on this spiritual journey, to see all things pregnant with the possibility of the holy. What would your Christmas season experience be like if you lived it looking through the kaleidoscope of the sacred?

Second Sunday of Advent (December 3)- 10:30 a.m.): "Sacred People"

"Many nations will go and say, 'Come, let's go up to the Lord's mountain, to the house of Jacob's God so that he may teach us his ways and we may walk in God's paths." -- Isaiah 2:

"Mary said, 'I am the Lord's servant. Let it be with me just as you have said."" -- Luke 1: 26-38 "When Joseph woke up, he did just as an angel from God commanded and took Mary as his wife." -- Matthew 1: 18-25

Third Sunday of Advent (December 10- 10:30 a.m.): "Sacred Space"

Fourth Sunday of Advent – Paper Bag Christmas Pageant (December 17-10:30 a.m.): "Sacred Knowing"

"How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of a messenger who proclaims peace, who brings good news, who proclaims salvation, who says to Zion, 'Your God rules!'" -- Isaiah 52: 7-10 "The angel said, 'Don' t be afraid! Look! I bring good news to you—wonderful, joyous news for all people." -- Luke 2: 1-15

This Sunday, we will thank Pastor Diane for her service, followed by a reception.

Christmas Eve (December 24)- 4:00 p.m.: "Sacred Being" (there will be no morning worship). *"…he saved us because of his mercy, not because of righteous things we had done.
