# Pastor's Corner - Rev. Traci Smith

The Three "T"s of Stewardship, Time, Talent, and Treasure!

I don't know who coined the three "t's" of stewardship — time, talent and treasure, but I owe that person a debt of gratitude. I love thinking of stewardship in this wholistic way: not just money, but *all* of who we are and what we have to offer. When it comes to stewardship, the first thing that comes to mind is often money. And yet, a true model of stewardship includes much more. Don't get me wrong, Elmhurst Presbyterian Church needs plenty of money to sustain our ministries. This week we've sent out letters and brochures detailing our plans for 2019 and our hopes that the money pledged will allow us to carry out these plans. I have faith that our community can and will step up and give financially to make sure that we are able to move forward and grow in faith! My hope is that we will really pray over those financial commitments and give in sacrificial and generous ways. I believe it can and will happen.

How will we also give of our time and our talents?

Since I moved to Elmhurst less than three months ago, I have been consistently blown away by the incredible talent in our congregation. We have folks from so many different professional backgrounds that can help us in all areas of our congregation life and ministry. From finance to congregational care, building and grounds and worship and music, we have people with the skills to serve. And yet, in my conversations with session and deacon leaders and others I am hearing many say that there are many more opportunities to give time and talent. In other words: there is much work to be done. There are many reasons it's difficult to give time and talents to a church. Sometimes we don't know exactly what's needed. Sometimes we aren't able to volunteer time because our schedules don't allow it. Sometimes our availability is only at the last minute. All of these things can make it hard to volunteer time and talent to our church.

How we overcome some of these challenges and make a faithful commitment to our church in time and talent? I don't know all the answers to this difficult question, but I invite you to think about it with me and experiment with different solutions as we work toward a robust stewardship drive in areas of time and talent, in addition to treasure. This year I'm asking all of us to make a time and talent commitment in addition to a financial one. For some, this will be very easy. For others, it might be more of a challenge. Emily and I have written down many opportunities and ways to give time and talent. These ways are written down on hands of different colors and displayed in the Nelson-White room in our church. We invite you to take a look at that ideas listed and choose one that appeals to you. This will be your time and talent contribution. On dedication Sunday, November 18, we will present our time and talent offerings to God in our worship service.

My hope is that this exercise of sharing time and talent along with money the stewardship season will not be a burden, but rather a joy. In the words of St. Francis of Assisi, "It is in giving that we receive."

I can't wait to see what God does when we all put our time, talent and treasure together, just as we have been doing at Elmhurst Presbyterian Church for over half a century.

This year we will remember that even as we *want*, there are plenty of people in our community who *need*. We are going to FILL THE STABLE in our community room with items that will stay right here in our community. As we do, we remember to give thanks to God for all of the things God has provided.

We will remember the Holy Family: Mary and Joseph, who travelled to Bethlehem while they were expecting baby Jesus. We'll consider what they need for their journey as they travel. Scripture tells us that whatever we do for others we do for Jesus. This is a way of making this a tangible reality.

Week one (December 2) -- What did the Holy Family wear? Bring new socks or underwear for our PADS guests. Large and extra large sizes are always appreciated. Help keep someone's feet warm, or provide basic dignity for those in need.

Week two (December 9) -- What do they need for warmth? Bring gloves, hats, and scarves to be donated to local clothes closets.

Week three (December 16) How do they take care of themselves? Bring new *full sized* toiletries of any type: shampoo, soap, toothpaste, razors or sanitary napkins. These items are often needed and harder to come by at the food pantry.

Week four -- (December 23) What do they need for a baby? Bring diapers or baby clothes for infants in need in our community. The baby Jesus didn't have much when he was born, neither do many babies in our community.

### **EPC GUN VIOLENCE MEETING**

Since October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, this month's meeting of Moms Demand Action in Elmhurst featured the Executive Director of the Chicago Metropolitan Battered Woman Network. She quoted some very interesting statistics: 20 people are exposed to domestic violence every minute in the US; the presence of a gun in the house makes a murder 500% more likely; DV hotlines get more than 20,000 calls each day; 1 in 3 female murder victims is killed by an intimate partner; 20% of murder victims with protective orders are murdered within two days of them getting the order; and 44% of mass shootings involved intimate partners.

There are both federal and state of Illinois laws that take guns away from domestic abusers. But gaps in the law allow these abusers to get more guns any way. And the present laws often don't go far enough, or aren't enforced efficiently enough.

There are two things we all can do if and when someone who is threatened at home comes to us for help (and as widespread a problem as this is, the chances are good that we all know someone): 1) Support the victim - listen, believe, help out, tell him/her about the options (The Domestic Violence Hotline will refer: 1-800-799-SAFE; and 2) Work for change. We can start be voting on November 6.

## SESSION NOTES—10/23/18

You may notice some changes around the church. Buildings and Grounds is making some improvements, including some new doors, to put us in compliance with the State Fire Marshall. This will help keep us, our guests, and our renters safer.

We have accepted Lori Bresson into membership.

With much regret, Session has decided not to renew Lor-Jon Montessori School's lease. There have been many concerns in dealing with their licensure renewal process.

It's Stewardship time and a commitment of talents and time is just as important to the church functioning as money. We will be offering up ways members can share their gifts as well as pledging.

Christian Youth Education has started the new Sunday School year. Our younger students will be learning from the Deep Blue Curriculum and a class of confirmation students will be studying an innovative curriculum designed by our CYE Director, Emily Culella, and co-taught with Faith Lee.

A task force has been formed to create an LGBTQI (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning, Intersex) inclusion policy and statement for our church. This will be posted on our website so that we can communicate to the community that we are a welcoming and inclusive church in line with the Presbyterian General Assembly.

Our Communication Committee is creating a promotional calendar for church events so that we can more proactively advertise our activities and outreach to the community. They will also be creating a Welcome Center in our lobby area as a place to greet visitors and share who we are. The Committee is also creating business cards to advertise EPC.

Pam Fuesz (chair of Mission), Pastor Traci, and Cheryl Kopecky received a tour of the Elmhurst Walk-in Assistance Network and presented them with a \$1,000 check from EPC. Mission is also giving an ongoing contribution of \$100 a month to the Elmhurst Yorkfield Food Pantry as well as purchasing \$100 worth of toiletry items to donate which cannot be bought at the Food Bank or with Food Stamps. This year's Thanksgiving Offering will be donated to the local chapter of Meals on Wheels (delivering meals to seniors). Mission is exploring other ways to participate in helping in our community.
