Pastor's Corner

In Matthew 17:20, Jesus says "For truly I tell you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you." On Easter morning, this was part of the message I preached. Resurrection faith, I argue, is not necessarily big and showy, it can be small and uncertain. Resurrection faith, even a whisper of faith, is enough to move mountains, according to the scriptures. Sometimes we get caught up in the how and the why of faith. We wonder exactly *how* Christ was resurrected and why. This is where one of my favorite theological words *mystery* comes in. Great is the mystery of faith we say. Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again. Let us cling to these words, even if we don't understand them. Easter is not simply a day, it's a season. Resurrection hope is more than just one day. As you consider this season, look around for signs of resurrection all around you. You will see them, in the birds, in the flowers, in the new life and new growth. Enjoy the season! Pastor Traci

Spring Clean-up

Many thanks to the people who cleaned up the grounds on April 13 and 20, including Liz Johnson who provided lunch on the 13th. Not only did we build muscles and burn lots of calories, but we also saved the church about \$300 that we would have had to pay for outside labor. The kids were even able to plant some cool weather crops in the vegetable garden!

Two Gardening Opportunities

The beds and borders are divided into sections, and somewhat like "Adopt-a-Highway," each person needs to maintain only his or her chosen area. If we had <u>18</u> volunteers, everything would easily be covered and all of the gardens would look beautiful all summer.

Opportunity #2: Children's Vegetable Garden ----

Every summer the children of the church help grow vegetables in the fenced garden on the north end of the grounds. The children harvest the produce on Sunday mornings, all of which is given to the Elmhurst-Yorkfield Food Pantry. Here, adult help is needed one week per month with watering, weeding, harvesting, and delivering the produce on weekdays. We need four volunteers for this opportunity.
